

The Future of the Hinton St Mary Mosaic

Following last month's article by Rev David Dunning concerning current display arrangements a meeting, attended by twenty seven villagers, the Mayor of Sturminster Newton and Chairman of the Trustees of the Exchange was held in the Village Hall. David Dunning advised the meeting that there were no plans for any part of the Mosaic to be displayed at the British Museum in the foreseeable future and it would remain in their stores until further notice. Dorset County Museum was offered the Mosaic in an attempt to return it to the county but the offer was rejected due to lack of space.



David felt that, as villagers had not been consulted about the decision, they should at least be made aware of it and, if possible, to have some input in where the Mosaic should be displayed in the future. A lively discussion ensued between the attendees about the possibilities for its return and barriers that were likely to be put up by the BM.

It was agreed that it was impracticable to return the Mosaic to HSM, due to the lack of infrastructure and the impact of large numbers of tourists on the village. There was, however, support for it to be housed somewhere in Sturminster Newton, which would certainly help to regenerate economic prosperity to the town. It was accepted that opening up discussions with the BM and other interested parties was the first step in the process.

Chris Hardiman agreed to act as the village representative on the Sturminster Newton Working Party set up to explore the town's regeneration. There was general agreement amongst the attendees of the great possibilities for the return of the Mosaic to be the catalyst for the regeneration of the whole area of North Dorset, which would include a focus on the literary and historical aspects and its beautiful countryside.

Hinton Recipe – Hinton Fruitcake (... for nuts)

You'll need the following:

- 1 cup of water
- 1 cup of sugar
- 4 large brown eggs
- 2 cups of dried fruit
- 1 teaspoon of salt
- 1 cup of brown sugar
- Lemon juice
- 1 cup of nuts
- 1 bottle of whisky.



Sample the whisky to check for quality.

Take a large bowl. Check the whisky again. To be sure it's the highest quality, pour one level cup and drink. Repeat. Turn on the electric mixer, beat one cup of butter in a large fluffy bowl. Add one teaspoon of sugar and beat again.

Make sure the whisky is still okay. Cry another tup. Turn off the mixer. Beat two leggs and add to the bowl and chuck in the cup of dried fruit. Mix on the tuner. If the fired fruit gets stuck in the beaters, pry it loose with a drowscriver.

Sample the whisky to check for tonsistency. Next, sift two cups of salt. Or something. Who cares? Check the whisky. Now sift the lemon juice and strain your nuts. Add one table. Spoon. Of sugar or something. Whatever you can find.



Grease the oven. Turn the cake tin to 350 degrees. Don't forget to beat off the turner. Throw the bowl out of the window. Check the whisky again and go to bed.

Appointment of New Vicar the Rev. Philippa Sargent

In early July the Bishop of Sherborne announced that Rev. Philippa Sargent had been appointed Vicar of Sturminster Newton, Hinton St. Mary and Lydlinch and Priest in Charge of Marnhull. These arrangements continue the pattern currently operating.

The recruitment process started in April and those who interviewed Philippa were unanimous that she is just the person needed to take the Benefice forward. Philippa is currently Assistant Curate of Kempsey and Severn Stoke With Croome d'Abitot in the Diocese of Worcester. Consequently she has a good understanding of the life and needs of people in country parishes. She trained for ordination at Ripon College, Cuddesdon, and prior to that, for 22 years was an officer in the Royal Navy, during which time, and somewhat unusually, she was stationed in Afghanistan. She specialised in Adult Education and Safeguarding.

She already has close family connections with the area and plans that her ministry here will very much focus on young families, pastoral care and community involvement. It is expected that her licensing will take place in early October and until then, for the remainder of the interregnum, the pattern of services currently running smoothly will continue.



Adult's Art Competition Classes

A piece of artwork in any medium and any size (within reason !!) for example, sketching, painting, collage, lino print, felt work etc. etc. which could fall under the heading of "**Dorset**".

Children's Art Competition Classes

1) 'A piece of artwork' of A4 size whether it be paper, card or whatever you like and once again, in any medium (drawing, painting, foil work, printing or collage using for example pasta, fabric or natural materials such as leaves, feathers, flowers etc. etc.) which could fall under the heading of "The Seasons".

The theme was originally "Summer" but as the competition date has been postponed to November, the new heading is "The Seasons"- so if you have already completed a piece of work it will not be wasted.

2) 'A Model' – your model can be made from anything :- boxes, clay, wire – anything you like, you choose. It can be a small or large, but please no bigger than 1m².
