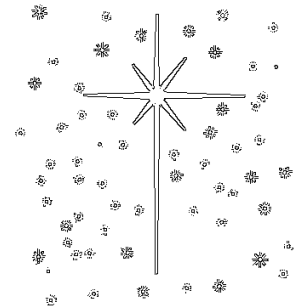

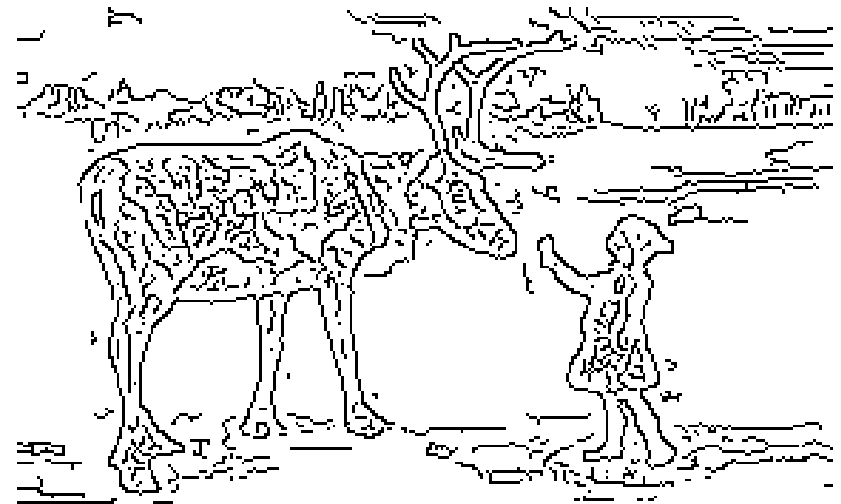

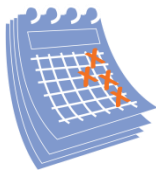

Service of Remembrance, 11th November 2018

A Service of Remembrance was held in St Peter's Church to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the armistice that brought an end to 'the Great War'.

The service was lead by the Rev David Dunning, a retired schoolmaster from Sherborne School who has generously provided very welcome support for some years prior to and throughout the vacancy that followed the departure of Rev David Seymour.

The Service remembered individually all those from Hinton St Mary who were lost in two world wars, the homily, sounding of the 'last post', a two minute silence and 'reveille'.

We were pleased to welcome to the church over 70 people from the village, most of whom stayed on in the church after the Service to share coffee, biscuits and a chat with friends and neighbours.

From the collection taken during the service the Church will make a donation to the Royal British Legion.
