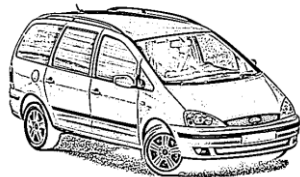

Sturminster Newton will hold its very first literary festival on June 15th. The town will celebrate past writers with connections to Sturminster Newton, current Dorset based authors, and aspiring writers of the future.

Most events will be free with donations. Highlights of Sturminster Newton Literary Festival include a new walk around the town celebrating areas connected with Thomas Hardy, William Barnes, and Robert Young. Dorset dialect poetry will be recited in various cafes and venues in the town, storyteller Tim Laycock will be telling the tale of Tess of the D'Urbervilles in 20 minutes and local historian David Fox and members of the William Barnes Society will give an introduction on 'How to speak Dorset'.

Visitors will be able to meet authors in various venues around Sturminster Newton in the morning where they will be discussing their books. The town will step back in time with residents and visitors being invited to wear Victorian costume with prizes for the best costumes.

The festival will benefit our shops and cafes on the day, and we hope people will want to come back to spend even more time with us.

Thomas Hardy spent his early years in and around Sturminster Newton and lived at Riverside Cottages where he wrote *The Return of the Native*. *Tess of the D'Urbervilles* and *The Woodlanders* are set in the area around Sturminster Newton.

William Barnes was born in Bagber, near Sturminster Newton and attended school in the town. Robert Young was born in Sturminster Newton in 1810 and both he and William Barnes wrote poetry in Dorset dialect.

Hinton St Mary Hedgehog Friendly Village Update

The first meeting with the Dorset Mammal Group on the 27th April was a great success and it was wonderful to see so many of you there and hear about all the prickly visitors we have in the village. This was the first step on our journey to becoming a hedgehog friendly village, there will be a second meeting at some point over the next few months that I will advertise in here as soon as I have a date. There will be a free hedgehog pack for everyone who attends this meeting and it doesn't matter if you missed the first one.

The talk by the DMG was extremely interesting, discussing not only hedgehogs but many other mammals too, it was accompanied by a slide show that included some wonderful images of them all. At the meeting I had a map of the village to record 2019 hedgehog sightings, it was great to see the areas that they visit in the village. If you do spot one it would be great to add it to the map so please keep me posted.



Here are some of the key pieces of advice we were given about how to encourage hedgehogs into our gardens.

1. Access is essential, a 13cm diameter hole is all that is required at the bottom of a fence, wall or gate for them to be able to get in your garden.
2. Hedgehogs can suffer from extreme dehydration after hibernation and during the hot weather, so a shallow dish of water (not milk as they are lactose intolerant) can be a lifesaver for them.
3. Should you enjoy feeding the hedgehogs then a dish of cat biscuits or hedgehog food is ideal. (Please no bread, mealworms, sunflower hearts or peanuts as they can cause a bone deficiency in the hogs).
4. Slug pellets can kill hedgehogs and are best avoided, the hogs will happily eat them for you!
5. Check areas of long grass before strimming as a hedgehog may have made a nest. Injuries from strimmers can be extremely horrific. (... *cont. over*)

Create a Mosaic For Gardens Open Weekend

The subject of the Mosaic is up to you - geometric design, animal (real or imaginary), a face, plants or a building. It should be made of small pieces of coloured card, but can be decorated with buttons, beads, feathers or other materials. The cards blocks should be stuck down onto a piece of firm card/tin lid/wood no more than 30 cm x 30cm. There will also be an opportunity to create your own mosaic during Open Gardens to take home if you do not wish to enter into any of the classes. All equipment to make your mosaic during the weekend will be available for children and adults for a small donation.

This event is being sponsored by the Blackmore Vale Arts Society. Prizes for the most interesting mosaics will be awarded in the following four classes:

- **Under 5 years old**
- **5 - 10 years old**
- **10 years + and adults**



Judging will take place at 5 pm on Sunday 16th June.
