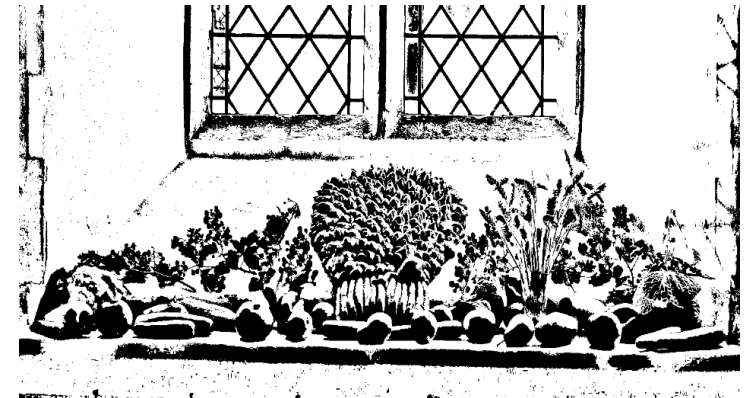

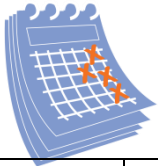

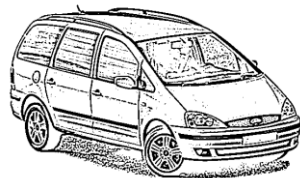

## Hedgehog Friendly Village Update

Thank you to everyone that attended the follow up meeting for this project, it was wonderful to see so many people together sharing their hedgehog success stories and enjoying some delicious cakes! I am thrilled to let you all know that we are now a recognised Hedgehog Friendly Village with the Dorset Mammal Group which is a fantastic achievement, thank you for all your support.

As hibernation season approaches in November/December it is time to keep an eye out for hoglets and small hedgehogs. Hedgehogs should ideally weigh around 600g plus by the end of October to successfully hibernate and wake up healthy next spring. If you are concerned about any small hedgehogs in your garden then local rescues can offer plenty of advice as some of them may need to be overwintered in a rescue to put on weight and be released next spring. I have contact details for some local rescues as do The British Hedgehog Preservation Society and The Dorset Mammal Group should you require them.

## Crisp Packet Recycling ??

If anyone is looking for somewhere to drop off crisp packets for recycling there is a collection box at Stower Provost Community School. They can accept all brands of crisp packets and they can be standard size, grab bags, sharing bags and multi pack bags. The packets must be empty and not tied in knots or folded in to triangle. The scheme is sponsored by Walkers so they can only take crisp packets at present, so no popcorn, mini cheddar or biscuit wrappers etc.

The packets are sent to Terracycle where they are separated by plastic type, cleaned and extruded in to plastic pellets to make new recycled products.



There is a collection box outside the front door of the school 24/7 so feel free to drop them off whenever you are passing.
