Curates Corner

On the 8th May we commemorate Julian of Norwich, born around 1342. Very little is known of the personal life of Julian, apart from the fact that she was an anchoress enclosed in her cell at the Church of St Julian and St Edward at Carrow. An anchoress is someone who renounces the world and enters a closed life to pray and contemplate. The cells were not necessarily very austere, we know that Julian had two servants, and that she was visited and her counsel sought by pilgrims. She wasn't walled up!

The most momentous day of her life came when she was 31, when she was given 16 "shewings". She wrote two accounts of that event, one just straight after, and a longer version twenty years later, written down in a book called The Revelations of Divine Love.

Her greatest theme is of immense love of God for his creatures. Because of her overwhelming certainty of the love of God Julian comes across as very up-beat, but she is never starry eyed. She is aware and struggles with sin and darkness, but she never loses her certainty that love will ultimately triumph.

The most striking part of her writing is that when she describes the motherhood of God revealed in Jesus. As she says, *"This fair lovely word Mother, it is so sweet...that it may not verily be said of none but him."* This may be a shock to us; it was in Julian's day, but she is not clumsy in her handling of the subject, but presents a good case for such a tender use of language.

"You would know our Lord's meaning in this thing? Know it well. Love was his meaning. Who showed it you? Love. What did he show you? Love. Why did he show it? For love. Hold on to this and you will know and understand love more and more. But you will not learn or know anything else - ever!"




